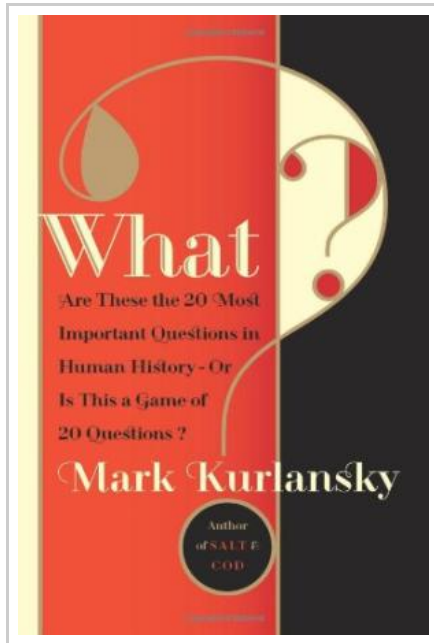




What?: Are These the 20 Most Important Questions in Human History Or is This a G
