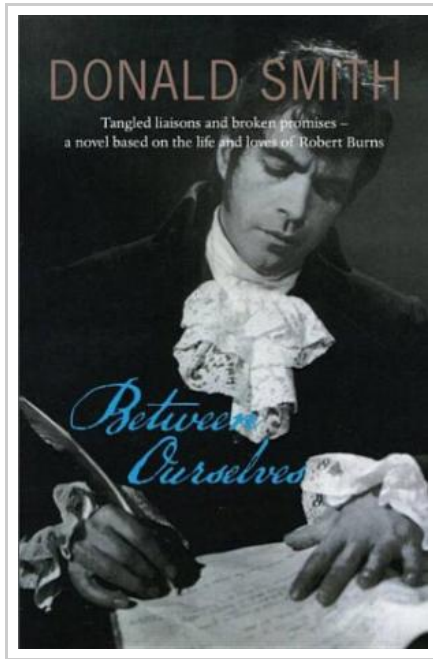




Between Ourselves

He was often conflicted with crippling self-doubt about his talents and bitter about his place in society.
